The word ROCORI is well known around the region and represents communities working together with common visions and goals. The name comes from ROCKVILLE, COLD SPRING and RICHMOND. Not only does it reflect area pride but also a common link with schools, community leadership and citizen involvement. You can see that the name ROCORI Trail is both fitting and timely.

Trail Update for 2006

- ◆ The Rocori Trail Committee has been meeting since mid 2004.
- ◆ Citizens from Richmond, Cold Spring and Rockville serve on the committee.
- ◆ The Rocori Trail will be about 12 miles long and has two phases:
Phase I – east end of Richmond to east end of Cold Spring
Phase II – east end of Cold Spring to east end of Rockville.
- ◆ An open house on the Rocori Trail concept was held in late 2005 and approximately 70 people attended. A second open house was held in January 2007.
- ◆ A federal grant of \$526,964 was received for Phase I.
- ◆ A study of the proposed trail corridor was conducted and shows that the trail is feasible along the railroad corridor. Links to this corridor are also viewed as beneficial.
- ◆ The committee continues to seek state and federal dollars to complete the two phases.




