The word **ROCORI** is well known around the region and represents communities working together with common visions and goals.

The name comes from **ROCKVILLE**, **COLD SPRING** and **RICHMOND**. Not only does it reflect area pride but also a common link with schools, community leadership and citizen involvement. You can see that the name ROCORI Trail is both fitting and timely.

Trail Update

The Rocori Trail Committee has been meeting since mid 2004. Citizens from Richmond, Cold Spring and Rockville serve on the committee.

The Rocori Trail will be about 12 miles long and has 3 phases:

Phase I – 178th Ave to Cold Spring's eastern city limits. Completion, Fall 2012

Phase II – Cold Spring's eastern city limits to Rockville's western city limits.

Phase III – Rockville's western city limits to Rockville's eastern city limits.

Open houses have been held over the years with approximately 150 attending.

A federal grant of \$526,964 was received for Phase I.

Rockville downtown completed in 2008.

A study of the proposed trail corridor was conducted and shows that the trail is feasible along the railroad corridor. Links to this corridor are also viewed as beneficial.

State Bonding Approved \$392,000.00

The committee continues to seek state and federal dollars to complete the phases.






